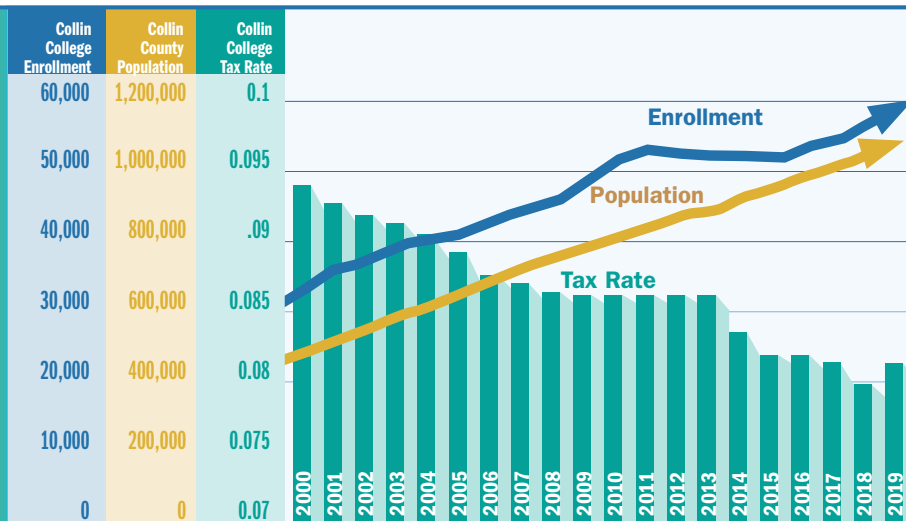


Lady Cougars Basketball **won** the North Texas Junior College Athletics Conference. That makes **five of the last six seasons** as conference champions or co-champs.

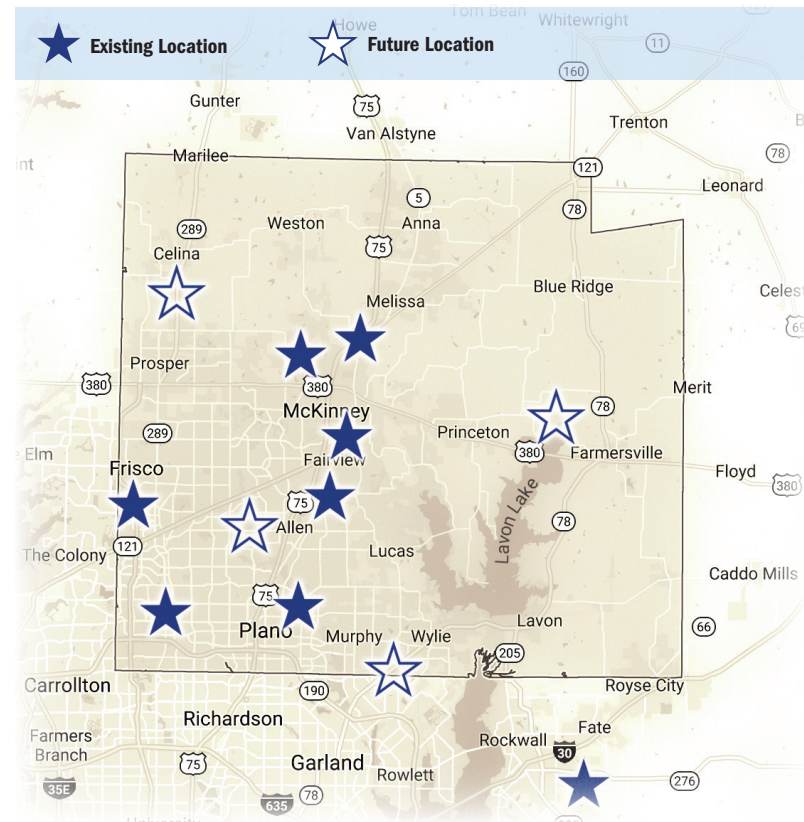

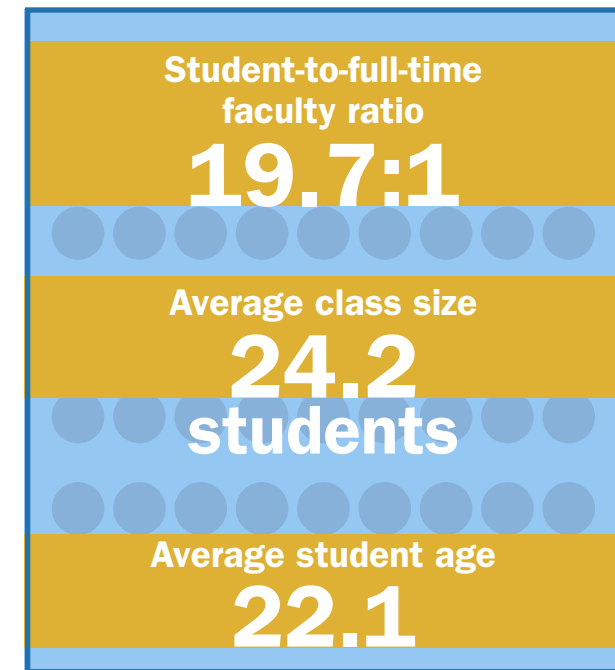
Planned for Fall 2021
